In her native Yugoslavia (Serbia) **Snezana Krstic** was active as a pianist, professor of music, and a member of chamber ensembles. At 16 years of age, she became the youngest student at Belgrade University School of Music from which she holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music and a Master's Degree in Piano Performance. She also spent one year in Moscow on postgraduate studies. Since moving to the United States, she has worked as an accompanist for Ballet Arizona School & Company, Rosie's House: A Music Academy for Children, and the Maricopa Community Colleges (Scottsdale & Paradise Valley). She frequently performs as a soloist, and with chamber ensembles. She is a member of the MTNA, ASMTA and PMTA. She is chairperson of PMTA's Celebration of Music Competition, and is a frequent adjudicator. Currently, she teaches piano classes and private lessons at Paradise Valley Community College, at Rosie's House: A Music Academy for Children in Phoenix, and in her home studio. Her students regularly attend competitions and receive numerous awards and prizes.

Peggy Rostron is director of The Rostron Piano Studio, pianist with MusicaNova Orchestra and West Valley Symphony, and freelance accompanist and soloist. She holds 3 degrees in piano performance, including a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Iowa, and she has been active as a teacher for over 30 years, and soloist/collaborative pianist for over 40 years. As accompanist-collaborative artist, she has performed with vocal and instrumental soloists, opera, choir, orchestra, and chamber music. She is an active member of MTNA, ASMTA and PMTA, where she serves as chair of the teacher referral service, and she has presented at meetings on the national, state and local levels. She is also currently director of the prestigious Arizona Youth Piano Competition, sponsored by Keogh Health Foundation.
